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The SPARTA Annual General Meeting took place on 13th December. Here is a short summary

The SPARTA Annual General Meeting took place on 13th December 2023 at 4.30pm in Room 3.15, Great Minster House.

The meeting was very well attended with nearly all the current clubs being represented and the actual room was full, and all the seats taken.



The AGM had the usual items on the agenda. There were a few apologies for absence noted and the minutes of the previous AGM were agreed without any changes.

Our Chairman, Rod Paterson, gave a good summary of the year's activities and thanked everyone for their hard work in keeping SPARTA and the clubs going.

The annual report was agreed and is now available on the SPARTA website.

The current Executive Committee was reelected to represent you. It was also agreed that we would continue with dual Presidents following a request by the Permanent Secretaries.

We discussed how to continue to raise SPARTA's profile, advertise our activities and that we welcome any ideas.

We are also keen for our clubs and societies to really promote what they do and to create new opportunities.

We want to make SPARTA even more attractive for our members so always keen to hear any thoughts.

The big change this year was the adoption of a new version of the Constitution. The new version modernises the wording throughout, changes a few management practices and makes it easier to set up and run SPARTA clubs.

The new Constitution was voted in unopposed. This is very exciting as it really helps SPARTA to move forward and offer you the services and opportunities that you want. The new Constitution is now available on the SPARTA website.

The AGM concluded with any other business which included a request that we offer direct debits for retired members. This is something that we are looking to implement.
