

# THE HISTORY SOCIETY'S SPRING


The SPARTA History Society have got a number of exciting lectures coming up this year here are details of the next few.

Tuesday 25 February Luke Pepera - Motherland: 500,000 Years of African History, Cultures, and Identity Great Minster House room LG11, 1pm



Historian, archaeologist, and anthropologist Luke Pepera takes us on a personal journey discovering 500,000 years of African history and cultures in order to reclaim and reconnect with this extraordinary heritage.

He tackles the question many people of African descent ask - Who are we? Where do we come from? What defines us? And it explores how knowledge of this deeper history might affect current understandings of African identity. Through thematically-linked chapters that explore aspects of African identity from nomadic culture and matriarchal society to beliefs about the afterlife and the tradition of oral storytelling, and interwoven with Luke's own experiences of exploring his Ghanaian family history and his personal questions of identity, this is a comprehensive, relevant and beautifully told new history of Africa, and how it has shaped the world we know today.



Thursday 27th February, Road to the Stockton & Darlington Railway: The first steam powered passenger train on a public railway - Chris Valkoinen, curator of railways and communication at the National Railway Museum Great Minister House Room LG1, 1pm

As part of DfT internal events celebrating Railway 200 Chris

Valkoinen, curator at the National Railway Museum will present a talk about the road to the Stockton and Darlington Railway.

On 27 September 1825 a small steam locomotive, now known as Locomotion, left Shildon on a momentous journey. Pulling a mix of coal wagons, a carriage, and wagons full of passengers, this was the first steamhauled passenger train on a public railway. Its progress was watched by huge crowds who sensed that the world had just changed. However, railways had existed in various forms before 1825. The talk will look at what led up to 27 September 1825 and what happened in the following few years.

Chris Valkoinen, is curator of railways and communication at the National Railway Museum and curator of the Railway Firsts exhibition in Locomotion in Shildon, he looks at 200 years of railways that led to the Stockton and Darlington Railway. He is the author of Railways: A History in Drawings, and The Big British Railway Journey Puzzle Book.

### Tuesday 3rd March A History of Homelessness Online Talk 1pm




Join us for a thought-provoking talk on A (Short) History of Homelessness, charting the story of one of society's great challenges through the lens of legislation, the birth and evolution of the homelessness charity sector and the lived experience of the roofless and those facing housing insecurity.

MHCLG policy official Troy Fores Masculet will be joined by Matt and Jess Turtle, co-founders of the firstof-its-kind Museum of Homelessness to offer perspectives and pinpoint key moments from the Georgian era through to the present day. The event will be presented live from the museum, in north London.

#### The Son of Prophecy: The Rise of Henry Tudor - Nathen Amin Online Talk from Great Minster House LG 9 1pm

**Tuesday 11th March** 



As England's most celebrated royal dynasty, it's often overlooked that the Tudors have their origins in rural Wales, far from the urban centres of English power where they dared to become great.

When Henry Tudor won the English crown by defeating Richard III in battle, he was a stranger to the people he now ruled, an 'unknown Welshman' in the words of his defeated foe. In his native Wales, however, Henry had long been championed as the Son of Prophecy, a foretold national messiah who would free his oppressed people from their lengthy misery. How had this remarkable situation come about? In this lucid and riveting account, Nathen Amin deftly explores how one redoubtable Welsh family thrived during lean years of political chaos, national instability, and intergenerational bloodshed to leave behind a complex legacy that changed the face of England and Wales forever. It is a passionately told tale of treachery, cunning, love, and heartbreak. From Penmynydd to Bosworth, this is the enthralling, action-packed story of the Tudors, but not as you know it.

Nathen Amin is an author and broadcaster from Wales, who focuses on the 15th Century and the reign of Henry VII. He wrote 'Tudor Wales' in 2014 and 'York Pubs' in 2016, followed by the first full-length biography of the Beaufort family, 'The House of Beaufort' in 2017, an Amazon #1 Bestseller in three historical categories (Wars of the Roses, Norman England, and The Plantagenets & Medieval History).
